# LEGISLATIVE JOINT AUDITING COMMITTEE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE AUDIT

Financial and Compliance Report

City of Tuckerman, Arkansas Officials and Council Members Legislative Joint Auditing Committee

A priority of Arkansas Legislative Audit is to assist local government officials by promoting sound financial management and accountability of government resources. The Legislative Auditor reports on the fiscal affairs of local governments, as well as compliance with relevant state laws and observance of good business practices to provide accountability for tax dollars expended to support government operations.

We have performed certain limited procedures with respect to cash basis financial information and compliance with certain state laws and accepted accounting practices for the City of Tuckerman, Arkansas, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2022, and have issued our report thereon dated January 3, 2024. These procedures were not performed for the Water and Sewer Fund. Management of the City is responsible for maintaining the financial records and complying with state laws and accepted accounting practices.

The findings contained in this section relate to the following officials who held office during 2022:

Mayor: Rick Womack

City Clerk/Treasurer: Vickie Adams

Police Chief: Justin Collom (resigned December 12, 2022)

We evaluated the City's compliance with certain state laws concerning general and district court accounting, budgeting, purchasing, and investing and depositing of public funds.

Noncompliance with state law and accepted accounting practices was noted in the offices of Mayor and City Clerk/Treasurer.

#### Mayor and City Clerk/Treasurer

Review of credit card charges for the period January 1, 2022, through December 31, 2022, revealed the following improper disbursements totaling \$9,925:

- \$5,879 in undocumented or inadequately documented purposes, the validity of which could not be determined.
  - \$2,222 for lodging.
  - \$974 for registration fees for various training courses.
  - o \$392 for utilities.
  - o \$254 for meals.
  - \$2,037 for miscellaneous purchases:
    - ⇒ \$981 for purchases from Amazon, Sam's Club, Tractor Supply, and Family Dollar.
    - ⇒ \$759 for apparent training and conference expenses.
    - $\Rightarrow$  \$297 for other items.
- \$2,464 for meals and lodging without a documented business purpose.
- \$713 for food without a documented business purpose.
- \$513 for fuel purchased for personal vehicles.
- \$151 for miscellaneous purchases without a documented business purpose.
- \$124 for late fees.
- \$81 for personal expenses that were reimbursed to the City by the Clerk Treasurer.

#### Mayor

The 2022 General and Street Fund expenditures exceeded budgeted appropriations by \$227,837 (37%) and \$37,779 (36%), respectively, in noncompliance with Ark. Code Ann. § 14-58-203. A similar finding was noted in the previous three reports dating back to 2018.

#### City Clerk/Treasurer

A complete financial report including receipts, disbursements, balances on hand, and liabilities was not presented to council members, in noncompliance with Ark. Code Ann. § 14-43-506.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee, local City government, state executive and oversight management, and other parties as required by Arkansas Code, and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties. However, pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 10-4-417, all reports presented to the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee are matters of public record and distribution is not limited.
