Financial and Compliance Report

City of Tyronza, Arkansas Officials and Council Members Legislative Joint Auditing Committee

A priority of Arkansas Legislative Audit is to assist local government officials by promoting sound financial management and accountability of government resources. The Legislative Auditor reports on the fiscal affairs of local governments, as well as compliance with relevant state laws and observance of good business practices to provide accountability for tax dollars expended to support government operations.

We have performed certain limited procedures with respect to cash basis financial information and compliance with certain state laws and accepted accounting practices for the City of Tyronza, Arkansas, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2022, and have issued our report thereon dated July 12, 2023. These procedures were not performed for the Water and Sewer Department. Management of the City is responsible for maintaining the financial records and complying with state laws and accepted accounting practices.

The finding contained in this section relate to the following officials who held office during 2022:

Mayor: Charles Glover Recorder/Treasurer: Donna Wood District Court Clerk: Donna Wood Police Chief: Mark Spain (appointed March 28, 2022) Vacant (January 1, 2022 – March 27, 2022)

We evaluated the City's compliance with certain state laws concerning general and district court accounting, budgeting, purchasing, and investing and depositing of public funds.

Noncompliance with state law and accepted accounting practices was noted in the office of Mayor.

Mayor

On April 21, 2022, the Council agreed to pay for repairs to a house rented by the Police Chief but not owned by the City. In turn, the landlord agreed to allow the Police Chief to make rental payments to the City. During 2022, the City paid \$2,071 for repairs to the house, and the Chief paid \$611 to the City for rental payments, in apparent conflict with Ark. Const. art. 12, § 5. According to City officials, the landlord agreed to reimburse the City for any reasonable repairs; however, as of July 12, 2023, the City had received no reimbursements.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee, local City government, state executive and oversight management, and other parties as required by Arkansas Code, and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties. However, pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 10-4-417, all reports presented to the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee are matters of public record and distribution is not limited.
