City of Wiederkehr Village, Arkansas Officials and Council Members Legislative Joint Auditing Committee

A priority of Arkansas Legislative Audit is to assist local government officials by promoting sound financial management and accountability of government resources. The Legislative Auditor reports on the fiscal affairs of local governments, as well as compliance with relevant state laws and observance of good business practices to provide accountability for tax dollars expended to support government operations.

We have performed certain limited procedures with respect to cash basis financial information and compliance with certain state laws and accepted accounting practices for the City of Wiederkehr Village, Arkansas, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, and have issued our report thereon dated May 9, 2024. Management of the City is responsible for maintaining the financial records and complying with state laws and accepted accounting practices.

The findings contained in this section relate to the following officials who held office during 2023 and 2022:

Mayor: Jeff Coley

Recorder/Treasurer: Michelle Robbins

We evaluated the City's compliance with certain state laws concerning general and district court accounting, budgeting, purchasing, and investing and depositing of public funds.

Noncompliance with state law and accepted accounting practices was noted in the office of Recorder/Treasurer.

#### Recorder/Treasurer

The bank accounts were not properly reconciled, and reconciliations were not approved by someone other than the preparer, as required by Ark. Code. Ann. § 14-59-108. A similar finding was noted in the previous two reports.

The annual financial statements were not published or posted as required by Ark. Code Ann. § 14-59-116. A similar finding was noted in the previous two reports.

Cash receipts and disbursements journals were not properly posted and reconciled with bank deposits and withdrawals, in noncompliance with Ark. Code Ann. §§ 14-59-108, 110, 111. A similar finding was noted in the previous report.

Minutes, ordinances, and resolutions were not readily available for inspection. In addition, the forementioned documents were not properly signed as required by Ark. Code Ann. § 14-55-205.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee, local City government, state executive and oversight management, and other parties as required by Arkansas Code, and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties. However, pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 10-4-417, all reports presented to the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee are matters of public record and distribution is not limited.
