Financial and Compliance Report

Town of Banks, Arkansas Officials and Council Members Legislative Joint Auditing Committee

A priority of Arkansas Legislative Audit is to assist local government officials by promoting sound financial management and accountability of government resources. The Legislative Auditor reports on the fiscal affairs of local governments, as well as compliance with relevant state laws and observance of good business practices to provide accountability for tax dollars expended to support government operations.

We have performed certain limited procedures with respect to cash basis financial information and compliance with certain state laws and accepted accounting practices for the Town of Banks, Arkansas, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2023, and have issued our report thereon dated October 10, 2024. These procedures were not performed for the Water and Sewer Department. Management of the Town is responsible for maintaining the financial records and complying with state laws and accepted accounting practices.

The findings contained in this section relate to the following officials who held office during 2023:

We evaluated the Town's compliance with certain state laws concerning general and district court accounting, budgeting, purchasing, and investing and depositing of public funds.

Noncompliance with state law and accepted accounting practices was noted in the office of Recorder/Treasurer.

#### Recorder/Treasurer

A review of the Town's payroll records revealed Internal Revenue Service (IRS) quarterly 941 reports were not prepared, and the Town did not remit payroll withholdings for reporting periods dating back to 2018. Because the Town had not received any correspondence from the IRS, we were unable to determine the total amount owed by the Town, including any potential penalties and interest.

Prenumbered receipts were not issued for all monies received, in noncompliance with Ark. Code Ann. § 14-59-109. A similar finding was noted in the previous two reports.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee, local Town government, state executive and oversight management, and other parties as required by Arkansas Code, and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties. However, pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 10-4-417, all reports presented to the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee are matters of public record and distribution is not limited.
