A priority of Arkansas Legislative Audit is to assist local government officials by promoting sound financial management and accountability of government resources. The Legislative Auditor reports on the fiscal affairs of local governments, as well as compliance with relevant state laws and observance of good business practices to provide accountability for tax dollars expended to support government operations.

We have performed certain limited procedures with respect to cash basis financial information and compliance with certain state laws and accepted accounting practices for the Town of Biggers, Arkansas, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2022, and have issued our report thereon dated November 15, 2023. These procedures were not performed for the Water and Sewer Department. Management of the Town is responsible for maintaining the financial records and complying with state laws and accepted accounting practices.

We evaluated the Town's compliance with certain state laws concerning general accounting, budgeting, purchasing, and investing and depositing of public funds.

Noncompliance with state law and accepted accounting practices was noted in the office of the Mayor.

An audit or agreed-upon procedures report and compilation has not been completed for the Water and Sewer Fund since 2017, as required by Ark. Code Ann. § 14-234-119. A similar finding was noted in the previous report.
