Town of Jacksonport, Arkansas Officials and Council Members Legislative Joint Auditing Committee

A priority of Arkansas Legislative Audit is to assist local government officials by promoting sound financial management and accountability of government resources. The Legislative Auditor reports on the fiscal affairs of local governments, as well as compliance with relevant state laws and observance of good business practices to provide accountability for tax dollars expended to support government operations.

We have performed certain limited procedures with respect to cash basis financial information and compliance with certain state laws and accepted accounting practices for the Town of Jacksonport, Arkansas, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2022, and have issued our report thereon dated August 1, 2023. These procedures were not performed for the Water and Sewer Department. Management of the Town is responsible for maintaining the financial records and complying with state laws and accepted accounting practices.

The findings contained in this section relate to the following officials who held office during 2022:

Mayor: Marcus Dodson Recorder/Treasurer: Deanna Dodson

We evaluated the Town's compliance with certain state laws concerning general accounting, budgeting, purchasing, and investing and depositing of public funds.

Noncompliance with state law and accepted accounting practices was noted in the office of Recorder/Treasurer.

Recorder/Treasurer

- 1. Cash receipts and disbursement journals were not properly classified and did not have yearly totals for each fund, as required by Ark. Code Ann. §§ 14-59-110, -111. In addition, some check dates and payees noted in the disbursement journal did not match the canceled check. A similar finding was noted in previous reports dating back to 2011.
- 2. Bank accounts were not properly reconciled and were not approved by someone other than the preparer, as required by Ark. Code Ann. § 14-59-108. A similar finding was issued in previous reports dating back to 2008.
- Prenumbered receipts were not issued for all funds received, in noncompliance with Ark. Code Ann. § 14-59-109. A similar finding was issued in previous reports dating back to 2010.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee, local Town government, state executive and oversight management, and other parties as required by Arkansas Code, and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties. However, pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 10-4-417, all reports presented to the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee are matters of public record and distribution is not limited.
