Town of Mount Vernon, Arkansas Officials and Council Members Legislative Joint Auditing Committee

A priority of Arkansas Legislative Audit is to assist local government officials by promoting sound financial management and accountability of government resources. The Legislative Auditor reports on the fiscal affairs of local governments, as well as compliance with relevant state laws and observance of good business practices to provide accountability for tax dollars expended to support government operations.

We have performed certain limited procedures with respect to cash basis financial information and compliance with certain state laws and accepted accounting practices for the Town of Mount Vernon, Arkansas, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, and have issued our report thereon dated July 10, 2024. Management of the Town is responsible for maintaining the financial records and complying with state laws and accepted accounting practices.

The findings contained in this section relate to the following officials who held office during 2023 and 2022:

Mayor: Jonathon Hawkins Recorder/Treasurer: Sherry Beeson

We evaluated the Town's compliance with certain state laws concerning general accounting, budgeting, purchasing, and investing and depositing of public funds.

Noncompliance with state law and accepted accounting practices was noted in the offices of Mayor and Recorder/Treasurer.

Mayor

The governing body did not document the review of the prior report and accompanying comments at the first regularly scheduled meeting following receipt of the report, as required by Ark. Code Ann. § 10-4-418.

Recorder/Treasurer

Accounting procedures for municipalities are set forth in the Municipal Accounting Law, Ark. Code Ann. 14-59-101 – 14-59-119. The City was in noncompliance with these codes as noted below:

- The Recorder/Treasurer did not submit to the council a monthly financial report. A similar finding was noted in the previous report.
- The bank reconciliations were not approved by someone other than the preparer.
- Adequate supporting documentation was not maintained for tested disbursements of \$2,264 (24%) and \$5,332 (53%) in 2023 and 2022, respectively.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee, local Town government, state executive and oversight management, and other parties as required by Arkansas Code, and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties. However, pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 10-4-417, all reports presented to the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee are matters of public record and distribution is not limited.
