A priority of Arkansas Legislative Audit is to assist local government officials by promoting sound financial management and accountability of government resources. The Legislative Auditor reports on the fiscal affairs of local governments, as well as compliance with relevant state laws and observance of good business practices to provide accountability for tax dollars expended to support government operations.

We have performed certain limited procedures with respect to cash basis financial information and compliance with certain state laws and accepted accounting practices for the Town of Oakhaven, Arkansas, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2021 and 2020, and have issued our report thereon dated March 23, 2023. Management of the Town is responsible for maintaining the financial records and complying with state laws and accepted accounting practices.

We evaluated the Town's compliance with certain state laws concerning general and district court accounting, budgeting, purchasing, and investing and depositing of public funds.

Expenditures exceeded budgeted appropriations for the General Fund in 2021 and 2020 by \$9,563 (297%) and \$7,256 (193%), respectively, in noncompliance with Ark. Code Ann. § 14-58-203.
