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# INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANT'S REPORT ON APPLYING AGREED-UPON PROCEDURES

To the Board of Directors, Wilburn Water Association, Inc.

We have performed the procedures enumerated below, which were agreed upon by the management of the Wilburn Water Association, Inc. in order to comply with Arkansas Code Annotated 14-234-119 through 14-234-122 and *Guidelines for Conducting Agreed-Upon Procedures for Water and Sewer Service Providers* prepared by the Arkansas Legislative Joint Audit Committee solely to assist you with respect to the accounting records of Wilburn Water Association, Inc. as of and for the year ended December 31, 2022. Wilburn Water Association, Inc.'s management is responsible for the entity's accounting records. The sufficiency of these procedures is solely the responsibility of those parties specified in the report. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

The procedures and associated findings are as follows:

- 1) Cash
  - a) Perform a proof of cash for the year and reconcile the year-end balances to book balances.
  - b) Confirm with depository institutions the cash on deposit and investments.
  - c) Agree the proof of cash ending balances to the book balances within 5% or \$500, whichever is greater.

We found no exceptions as a result of the procedures.

### 2) Receipts

- a) Agree the deposits per the proof of cash for the year with the deposits per the journal within 5% or \$500, whichever is greater.
- Agree ten customer payments on the accounts receivable subledger to deposit and billing documents.
- c) For ten deposits, agree the cash/check composition of the deposit with the receipt information.

We found no exceptions as a result of the procedures.

- 3) Accounts Receivable
  - a) Agree ten customer billings to the accounts receivable subledger.
  - b) Determine that five customer adjustments were properly authorized.

We found no exceptions as a result of the procedures.

### 4) Disbursements

- a) Agree the disbursements per the proof of cash for the year with the disbursements per the journal within 5% or \$500, whichever is greater.
- b) Analyze all property, plant, and equipment disbursements.
- c) Select all disbursements paid to employees other than payroll and ten other disbursements and determine if they were adequately documented.

We found no exceptions as a result of the procedures.

- 5) Property, Plant and Equipment
  - a) Determine that additions and disposals were properly accounted for in the records. (Materiality level 5% of total equipment or \$500, whichever is greater.)

We found no exceptions as a result of the procedures.

- 6) Long-Term Debt
  - a) Schedule long-term debt and verify changes in all balances for the year.
  - b) Confirm loans, bonds, notes, and contracts payable with lender/trustee/contractor.
  - c) Determine that the appropriate debt service accounts have been established and maintained.

We found no exceptions as a result of the procedures.

### 7) General

a) Determine that any items of financial significance were approved and documented in the minutes of the governing body's meetings.

We found no exceptions as a result of the procedures.

8) We compiled a statement of financial position of Wilburn Water Association, Inc. as of December 31, 2022, and the related statement of activities for the year then ended in accordance with Statements on Standards for Accounting and Review Services issued by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. A copy of our report is included with this submission.

This agreed-upon procedures report was conducted in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. We were not engaged to, and did not conduct an audit, the objective of which would be the expression of an opinion on the accounting records. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to you.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the management of the Association, the Board of Directors, and Arkansas Legislative Joint Auditing Committee, and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.
